## ECONOMICS MINOR (21 units)

Minors must earn a minimum grade of C in each required course (CR/NC grading is permitted for core courses).

### Required Courses (9 units)

ECON 101	Introduction to Microeconomic Analysis
ECON 102	Introduction to Macroeconomic Analysis (formerly ECON 100)
ECON 301	Intermediate Microeconomic Theory
or ECON 302	Intermediate Macroeconomic Theory

**Electives (12 units):** Four courses selected from upper division elective economics courses. Upon prior advisement, two of these four courses may be from another department in a related discipline.
